A typical day for Rory involves starting at sunrise, sometimes before sunrise and ensuring all the above is in hand!

Rory takes on an active role within the local community and works closely with Musselburgh Golf Club to ensure the Golf Course and Racecourse work seamlessly together. Rory also knows the importance of keeping the track in 5-star condition and his team provides complimentary disposal of dog bin waste surrounding the racecourse. He also sweeps the local roads pre and post raceday to ensure they are kept clean. If you spot him out on the track, be sure to stop him and say hello!
